BOARD TO CONSIDER APPROVAL OF ACADEMIC PROGRAM CHANGES

Report:

Certificate Closures within Industrial Electronics Technology

The field of Advanced Manufacturing is cutting edge. Specifically, technology and automation innovate routinely. P&HCC embraces the pace of the future and works to maintain relevant and impending methods, technologies, and other advancements within Advanced Manufacturing. In recent years, two Career Studies Certificates in Mechatronics and Robotics & Automation Technology exemplify the actions P&HCC undertakes to ensure employers receive the most dynamic and current graduates.

As a result, certificates that were viable merely a few years ago have become antiquated and do not serve the needs of employers as well as the current offerings. Keeping misaligned credentials open promotes confusion to students and advisors and neither optimizes potential student earnings nor aligns with employer needs. To that end, P&HCC is recommending the following closures:

Industrial Controls Career Studies Certificate

Industrial Maintenance Career Studies Certificate

It is important to note that these recommended closures are being replaced by more relevant credentials. This poses no negative impact to students as the current credentials in Mechatronics and Robotics & Automation align much better with employer need and enhances the student opportunity for higher wages.

Certificate Closure within General Studies: Visual Arts Specialization

As part of the annual program reviews, all credentials are reviewed to determine viability. Within the General Studies degree, there is currently a specialization of Visual Arts. This subset of ART courses has its own credential, the Art Studies Career Studies Certificate. In recent years, and rightfully so, policy and process have been put in place to evaluate all credentials on transferability and/or employability. The Art Studies Career Studies Certificate neither enhances transferability nor employability as it is not a standalone associate degree and it does not lead to viable wages. It is the recommendation from P&HCC to close the Art Studies Career Studies Certificate.

In all, three recommendations from the P&HCC Curriculum Committee for the 2025-26 academic year are:

- 1) Closure of the Industrial Controls CSC
- 2) Closure of the Industrial Maintenance CSC
- 3) Closure of the Art Studies CSC

Recommendation:

It is the recommendation of the college administration that the Board approve these Academic Program Changes.

Report:

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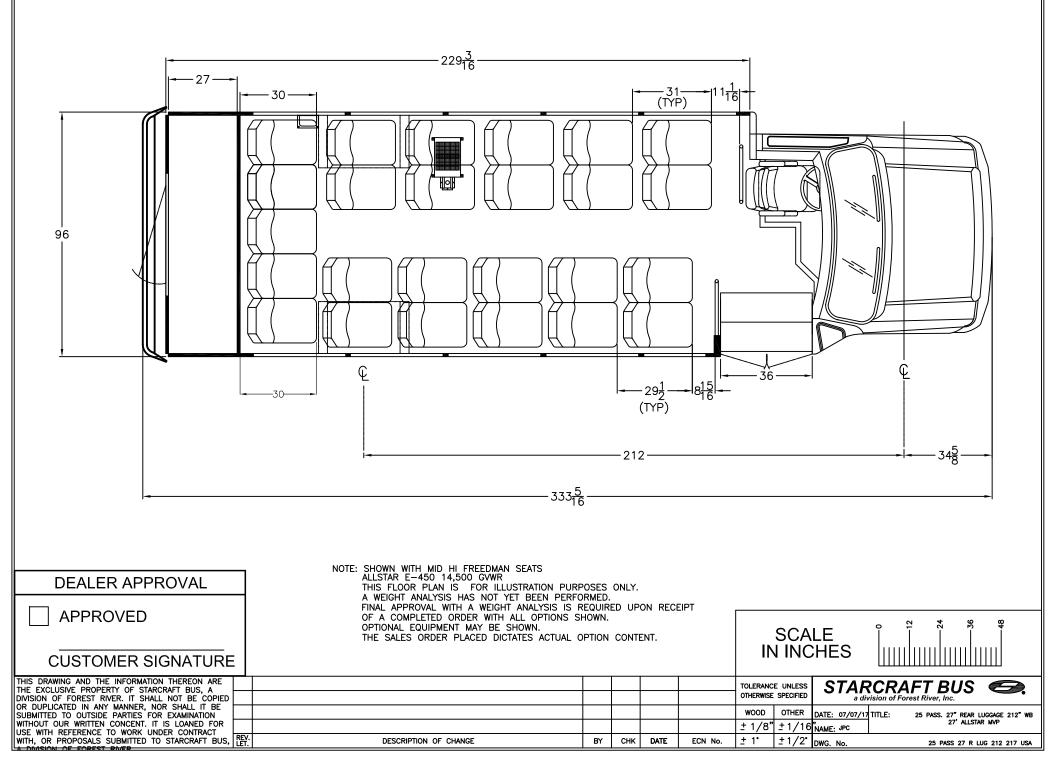
