BOARD TO CONSIDER APPROVAL OF FISCAL YEAR 2025 LOCAL FUNDS BUDGET

Report:

The college proposes changes to the Local Funds Budget to better support the Student Activities Fund. The proposed changes are described below.

Locality Fund. The College anticipates transferring \$45,000 to the Student Activity Fund.

<u>Auxiliary Fund</u>. The college anticipates transferring \$50,000 from Auxiliary Funds to support increased Student Activities. The college proposes to withdraw \$20,000 of dividends and capital gains distributions to Student Activities.

<u>Student Activities Fund</u>. The college's FY 2025 budget reserves a transfer of \$50,000 from Auxiliary Funds to Student Activities Fund and provides substantial foundation support. The college also anticipates transferring \$45,000 from locality funds to Student Activities.

<u>Parking Fund</u>. The college anticipates FY24 revenues of \$50,000.00. The college does not anticipate any parking lot or sidewalk repairs during the upcoming fiscal year. However, the college has budgeted \$25,000.00 as a contingency.

Recommendation:

It is the recommendation of the college administration that the Board approve the Local Funds Budget for fiscal year 2025.





The Economic Value of the Patrick & Henry Community College Athletics Department



Patrick & Henry Community College Athletics Department (P&HCC Athletics) creates a significant positive impact on the business community and generates a return on investment to its major stakeholder groups—students and society, along with substantial benefits to taxpayers. Using a two-pronged approach that involves an economic impact analysis and an investment analysis, this study calculates the benefits received by each of these groups. Results of the analysis reflect fiscal year (FY) 2022-23.

Economic impact analysis

In FY 2022-23, P&HCC Athletics added **\$2.4 million** in income to the P&HCC Service Region[°] economy. Expressed in terms of jobs, P&HCC Athletics' impact supported **68 jobs**.

Operations spending impact

- P&HCC Athletics employed 31 full-time and part-time faculty and staff. Payroll amounted to \$483.8 thousand, much of which was spent in the region for groceries, mortgage and rent payments, dining out, and other household expenses. The department spent another \$255.2 thousand on day-to-day expenses related to facilities, supplies, and professional services.
- The net impact of the P&HCC Athletics' operations spending added \$501.6 thousand in income to the regional economy in FY 2022-23.

For the purposes of this analysis, the P&HCC Service Region is comprised of Patrick and Henry Counties, the City of Martinsville, and the Southern Franklin County region.

The P&HCC Service Region, Virginia

Visitor spending impact

- Hundreds of out-of-region visitors attracted to the P&HCC Service Region for P&HCC Athletics' events brought new dollars to the economy through their spending at hotels, restaurants, gas stations, and other regional businesses.
- Visitor spending added approximately \$235.0 thousand in income to the P&HCC Service Region economy.

Student-athlete spending impact

- Approximately 72% of student-athletes attending P&HCC originated from outside the region. All these students relocated to the P&HCC Service Region. In addition, some in-region student-athletes, referred to as retained students, would have left the P&HCC Service Region for other athletic and scholastic opportunities if not for P&HCC Athletics. These relocated and retained students spent money on groceries, mortgage and rent payments, and other living expenses at regional businesses.
- The expenditures of relocated and retained student-athletes in FY 2022-23 added
 \$815.3 thousand in income to the P&HCC Service Region economy.

Alumni impact

- Over the years, student-athletes have studied at P&HCC and entered or re-entered the workforce with newly acquired knowledge and skills. Today, thousands of these former student-athletes are employed in the P&HCC Service Region.
- The net impact of P&HCC Athletics' former student-athletes currently employed in the regional workforce amounted to \$826.8 thousand in added income in FY 2022-23.



Student-athlete perspective

- P&HCC Athletics' FY 2022-23 student-athletes paid a present value of \$0.3 million to cover the cost of fees and supplies. They also forwent \$2.2 million in money that they would have earned had they been working instead of attending college.
- In return for their investment, student-athletes will receive a cumulative present value of \$8.2 million in increased earnings over their working lives. This translates to a return of \$3.30 in higher future earnings for every dollar students invest in their education. Student-athletes' average annual rate of return is 12.4%.

Taxpayer perspective

Taxpayers provided P&HCC Athletics with little to no funding in FY 2022-23. In return, they will benefit from added tax revenue, stemming from students' higher lifetime earnings and increased business output, amounting to \$1.5 million. A reduced demand for government-funded services in Virginia will add another \$162.1 thousand in benefits to taxpayers.


Students see a high rate of return for their investment in P&HCC Athletics

Social perspective

- . In FY 2022-23, Virginia invested \$3.2 million to support P&HCC Athletics. In turn, the Virginia economy will grow by \$15.7 million, over the course of student-athletes' working lives. Society will also benefit from \$485.4 thousand of public and private sector savings.
- For every dollar invested in P&HCC Athletics in FY 2022-23, people in Virginia will receive \$5.10 in return, for as long as P&HCC Athletics' FY 2022-23 student-athletes remain active in the Virginia workforce.

Dear Chancellor Doré,

As vice-chair (and incoming chair) of the Patrick & Henry Community College Board, I am writing to provide our assessment of Dr. Greg Hodges as president for academic year 2023/2024. Dr. Hodges has the full support of the entire P&HCC Board as well as the administration, faculty, and staff. Importantly, he maintains a place of profound respect within our community and is deeply engaged with the economic development efforts associated with our service region. He is also at the forefront of the many initiatives in which P&HCC makes an impact for our community and our students. Because of his leadership, our fiscal management remains strong.

During the previous academic year (2022/2023), the local board approved the P&HCC strategic plan presented by President Hodges which focuses on closing opportunity gaps and achieving excellence for all students regardless of race/ethnicity, gender, or socioeconomic status. With an intentional alignment with *Opportunity 2027* (now entitled *Opportunity 2030*) from the VCCS, the P&HCC plan has three main goals: enrollment stabilization (both academic and workforce), Gateway course completion, and credential attainment. To that end, Dr. Hodges began our 2023/2024 academic year with extremely impressive data demonstrating significant gains in student achievement. Please note the following:

- A 2% increase in annualized FTE over the previous academic year. It is important to note that this is the <u>first time in 14 years that P&HCC has experienced two years of back-to-back enrollment</u> <u>growth</u>.
- A 45% increase (as of April 15, 2024) in workforce enrollment over the previous academic year which builds upon the 40% increase from the previous year.
- A second place finish in Performance Based Funding among all 23 community colleges
- A 71% completion rate for academic Gateway courses (Goal: 70%).
- A 93% completion rate for workforce courses (Goal: 70%).
- A one-year growth in fall-to-fall retention rates of 9.8% with every student population demonstrating improvement.

Because of Dr. Hodges' keen focus on our community's economic development and the college's vision of economic mobility for our citizens, Patrick & Henry Community College received several national awards and accolades during this academic year. Please note the following:

- P&HCC was named as one of 20 colleges in the nation (and the only one in Virginia) to partner with the Society of Manufacturing Engineers (SME) to address the manufacturing industry's workforce shortage and skills gap crisis.
- The Early Childhood Education program received initial accreditation from the National Association of the Education of Young Children (NAEYC).



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- Patrick & Henry Community College was named one of the best colleges in the nation to work for, according to the Great Colleges to Work For® program. The college won honors in 6 categories this year: *Job Satisfaction & Support, Professional Development, Compensation & Benefits, Mission & Pride, Faculty Experience,* and *Confidence in Senior Leadership.* P&HCC was also named to the Great Colleges Honor Roll, a status granted to only 42 colleges each year who are highlighted most across the recognition categories.
- P&HCC was named the Entrepreneurial College of the Year by the National Association of Community College Entrepreneurship (NACCE).
- P&HCC was recognized by Festo and the National Coalition of Certification Centers (NC3) for awarding the most certifications of any college in the country.
- Because of its success in closing economic opportunity gaps for students, Patrick & Henry Community College was one of six colleges nationally to be named a Leader College of Distinction by Achieving the Dream (ATD).
- P&HCC was heavily featured in the "Chronicle of Education" publication entitled *Building the Rural Work Force: How Rural Colleges Meet the Needs of Nontraditional Students.*

While P&HCC is thrilled to receive such a tremendous amount of national attention, it is Dr. Hodges' focus on regional economic development that excites us the most. In December, the college celebrated the grand opening of the second building of our Manufacturing, Engineering, and Technology Complex (the MET), a 103,000 square foot facility that is dedicated to good paying jobs in our service region. With programs such as mechatronics, engineering, CADD, robotics, and the Racing College of Virginia, the MET has rightfully been referred to as our region's *Crown Jewel of Economic Development*. This second building triples our welding capacity and includes virtual welding, robotics welding, precision machining, and engine repair. With these kinds of impressive facilities, programs, and personnel, it is no wonder that the recently completed study by Lightcast indicates that the college produces an annual economic impact in excess of \$75 million for the communities served by P&HCC.

At the same time, Dr. Hodges has led the institution as it expanded our transfer partnerships and programs with our university partners and brought to scale new academic and workforce credentials to meet the workforce needs of our community. For example, the college is part of a consortium known as the SOVA Innovation Hub which received \$600,000 from Go Virginia Region 3 to fund the Rise Collaborative which will fortify Southern Virginia's standing as a central hub for fostering small business growth, innovation, and economic development. Additionally, P&HCC was awarded \$85,000 from the State Council of Higher Education of Virginia (SCHEV) to lead the Mike Rowe Works "Sweat Equity" training across all of Go-Virginia Region 3. Other local accomplishments shepherded by Dr. Hodges include the following:

- Launched a new powerline program in Patrick County which graduated its first cohort of students in December and will be graduating the second cohort in late May.
- Awarded a grant from The Gene Haas Foundation for \$18,000 to support mechatronics scholarships and student competition teams.
- Awarded \$149,000 from the Tobacco Commission to expand healthcare training (both academic and workforce) in Franklin County.
- Received word of 100% state board pass rates on the first attempt for both the LPN and RN programs. This means that the last three RN cohorts and the last two LPN cohorts have achieved



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this impressive result.

• Awarded \$51,000 from the Davenport Foundation to support an apprenticeship model for early childhood education.

Athletics has become an important part of the culture of Patrick & Henry Community College, and in this arena, President Hodges leads a tremendous staff. Our athletics department boasts the Region 10 soccer champions (which competed in this year's nationals), the Region 10 softball champions, and the Region 10 West baseball champions. P&HCC's outdoor track and field team is sending eight runners to nationals, and the wrestling team sent six to nationals. While these athletic accomplishments are outstanding on their own, what we on the board are specifically proud of is the fact that President Hodges leads an athletics team that is focused on academics! Impressively 53 of our athletes had GPAs greater than 3.5 and 37 had perfect 4.0 GPAs. President Hodges leads an athletic department where success on the field is matched by success in the classroom!

Finally, Dr. Hodges remains dedicated to diversity and inclusion at P&HCC. Under his leadership, the diversity of P&HCC's employment base now exceeds that of the community we serve. The college has a rich history of identifying and closing student opportunity gaps, and Dr. Hodges remains demonstrably committed to this critical work. These efforts are showing up in the student success metrics as evidenced by the following data points related to the one-year improvements in fall-to-fall retention rates.

- Females improved by 4.5%; Males improved by 13.3%.
- White students improved by 9.2%; African-American students improved by 10.0%; Hispanic students improved by 21.9%.
- Pell students improved by 13.6%; Non-Pell students improved by 3.4%.

It is evident to the board that Dr. Hodges' relationships with our K-12 and university partners, business and industry leaders, and regional non-profits help to ensure that P&HCC remains squarely focused on the economic mobility of our students. Consequently, the local board has been extremely pleased with Dr. Hodges this past year, and we look forward to his continued leadership of Patrick & Henry Community College.
